The Future of RI: Path2Integrity gathers more than 60 RI advocates for the project's final conference





Path2Integrity Training Programme for Educators



5 new videos uploaded to our YouTube channel

When completing this online course, you will be introduced to innovative teaching methods that will take topics in Research Integrity and Ethics to a tangible level. Any educator – experienced or inexperienced – with an interest in educating high school students, higher education students or early career researchers in topics of research integrity is encouraged to go through the five videos and the related exercises.

The overall purpose of the Path2Integrity training programme for educators (P2ITE) is to enhance educators' and teachers' competencies, confidence, and abilities to teach research integrity effectively mainly using the Path2Integrity learning materials and methods in an adaptive and sustainable way. This consists of innovative and fun learning/teaching methods including role-play and storytelling.

P2ITE is divided into three parts. The first part introduces you to the Path2Integrity project, followed by an introduction to research integrity and its importance. Next, you are going to learn more about the methods and the underlying concepts used within the Path2Integrity learning materials. Lastly, you will hear about how to prepare, implement and deliver the Path2Integrity learning materials in your educational context, so that you can feel more confident as a teacher and an educator using the learning cards in your classroom.

Teaching and learning RI: the Polish Perspective



During the last few weeks, we (IBE) successfully led 3 courses of P2ITE in Polish and 21 teachers and educators (20 Polish and 1 from Latvia) finished the training and received the certificates. We meet with the participants online and we delivered them not only interactive workshops but we also prepared some videos in Polish on project objectives and outcomes, on research integrity, on learning and promotion materials and on our P2I role models.

Moreover, we decided to print out selected learning and information materials (learning cards, leaflets, posters etc. in Polish) and we sent such packages to 20 Polish schools in different locations, so the educators can use them and attract more people to P2I concept of honesty and integrity.

We kept posting news on P2I events such as webinars led by Katharina Miller, podcasts led by Dick Bourgeois-Doyle; on the P2I course and the final conference to share the most important issues in Polish language and disseminate results of our international collaboration.

We organised additional informational events – 1-hour formal meeting at one of the Polish pedagogical universities: The Maria Grzegorzewska University – with junior & senior research staff (academic teachers) and 3 1-hour/1h 30 minutes seminars with BA and MA students of sociology at another academia – Collegium Civitas, where one of us: PhD Katarzyna Kalinowska-Sinkowska is a part of a new initiative to open a Department of Ethics and use P2I materials on a regular basis during teaching and meetings with students.

We hope to continue spreading the word on Path2Integrity results and building research integrity culture. Looking forward



Path2Integrity's Open Science Collection in RIO



Following the Open Science paradigm is a general strategy of the project. The Research Ideas and Outcomes (RIO) journal ensures transparency in science and allows scientists to open up the research cycles by featuring important intermediate research results, while encouraging transdisciplinary research by mapping papers to UN's SDGs. All items in a project collection are archived and additionally indexed, disseminated and cited. The Path2Integrity Open Science Collection in RIO hosts a comprehensive collection of project results as reusable, openly accessible, citable publications. The journal publishes various outputs of the research cycle, including the project proposal, data, feedback and research articles together on a single collaborative platform. In addition, RIO also links to all P2I publications available in other repositories by providing the metadata and link to the original resource. This allows to have all P2I outputs featured in one central place, while also making them available beyond the project's lifetime. The collection currently holds more than 30 project outputs!
